

Wildlife Policing and Firearms Committee

Held on 20 June 2024

The Committee discussed:

- 1. The Chair provided an update on recent feedback provided by the committee to Firearms Services relating to the proposed changes to firearm licence training requirements.
- 2. Dick Shaw (GST) attended to introduce himself to the committee and discuss key current issues including wildlife damage, the current permit systems and options for wildlife control.
- 3. Discussions were held around the Government's role in supporting farmers to control wildlife on their properties.
- 4. Inspector Phil Burton (Firearms Services) attended to brief the committee on the status of the Antique Firearm transition process. There will likely be a further set of amendments to the Act in relation to antique firearms.
- 5. Discussions were held around the proposed National Firearms Registry (NFR) and cyber security concerns with firearm licence holders reminded to remain vigilant.
- 6. Discussions were held regarding the issue of physical and mental health questions on Firearm licence application/renewal forms.
- 7. A brief update was given on current issues on King Island mainly in relation to feral cats and bird species including swans.
- 8. The committee discussed the importance of continuing to progress the discussion around exemptions for suppressors for use during wildlife control.
